

Trauma Responsive Education – Making SPACE for learning

The Australian Childhood foundation (ACF) has been working with schools across Australia for the past 15 years with the aim of enhancing trauma responsive practices for children and young people. What staff will learn from this training benefits all the students that we support.



What is the training about?

This workshop provides an overview of the making SPACE for learning framework and incorporates exploration of the areas of:

- The neurobiology of complex relational and developmental trauma
- ♦ How trauma impacts children and young people's brain, body, memory, emotions, relationships, behaviour and capacity to learn.
- Responses to traumatised children and young people within education settings
- Exploration of activities and strategies that can help heal the impacts of trauma to enable improved behavioural and cognitive capacity.



ECHUCA SCHOOL GARDEN AND CAFÉ NURTURING LOVE OF HEALTHY TASTY

Echuca Twin Rivers Specialist School (ETRSS) will host VicHealth CEO, Dr Sandro Demaio, along with representatives from Healthy Loddon Campaspe (HLC) on Thursday 14 March to showcase their innovative school kitchen garden and café program.

ETRSS has been working with State Government-funded initiative Healthy Loddon Campaspe to develop and deliver a true 'patch-to-plate' school kitchen garden program that encompasses the growing, cooking and eating journey to promote healthy eating within the school community and beyond.

Students are involved throughout the whole journey, from planting, cultivating and harvesting, to cooking and preparing food for sale in their public café.

ETRSS Assistant Principal, Ben Ridge said the garden and café program is an integral part. of the learning experience for students.

Students, no matter their ability, are gaining significant benefits from the garden, in terms of both a healthy eating and cooking perspective, through to positive impacts on emotional regulation." Mr Ridge said.

Healthy Loddon Campaspe Coordinator, Alicia O'Brien said working with the school to understand their current needs and adopting a partnership approach has seen many positive nescults.

"One of HLC's key priorities is to increase rates of healthy eating within the Loddon Campaspe region," Ms O'Brien said.

"By working closely with ETRSS to understand their capacity and requirements, we're proud to have assisted in the growth of their garden and café program.

The program has led to students having a stronger understanding of the benefits of growing their own food, and increased school and community engagement with healthy eating.

VicHealth CEO, Dr Sandro Demaio said he is looking forward to seeing the program in

*Connecting kids to the growing and cooking of healthy food at an early age has enormous benefits for their mental and physical health. It's fantastic to see strong community programs like this, which empower young people to learn about and love tasty, healthy food."

The school has further plans to develop their garden and café program, including propagating seedlings, developing a seed library, and increasing their café offerings to the community.


