



PODCAST OPPORTUNITY

Our VL students are taking part in a youth mini–Mental Health Podcast series in conjunction with headspace Echuca. The Podcast Challenge is an opportunity for local schools to come together to create a podcast relevant to the youth of this community. The podcast will focus on topics that impact them in their everyday lives. Our topic is Cyber safety.

The process of producing the podcast will involve:

- Session One: information about what the podcast will involve we heard from Jayden Howe from headspace regarding what we need to do to make a podcast and then Shane Roberts from Echuca Police spoke about some of the impacts from cyber issues that he sees in his job
- Session Two: working in small groups we will develop some questions and answers regarding
 - how cyber safety can affect mental health and how young people can be supported;
 - the issues here in our community and what the law says about cyber safety;
 - issues the students feel are relevant to them here at school and what supports they may need here;
 - discussing online bullying and the dangers around being online as a young person.



Session Three: recording the podcast. A group will travel to headspace for the filming and recording of our podcast

At the end of the filming, the schools will receive an E-book filled with podcasts, pictures from the filming day, and some resources to support their topic and more.

Each school will have a specified time to advertise and promote their podcast, after the specified time

the school with the most listens will win the "Challenge". The winner will receive a prize of podcasting equipment so they can go back to their respective schools and continue to teach the art of podcasting in an engaging student driven environment.
