Schools and early childhood services across Victoria are teaching Aboriginal languages

21 February marks UNESCO International Mother Language Day, which celebrates the importance of cultural and linguistic diversity for peaceful and sustainable societies.

In 2019, the UN International Year of Indigenous Languages, schools and early childhood services across Victoria are teaching Aboriginal languages with the support of Aboriginal teachers, Elders and communities.

Currently, there are 11 schools across Victoria teaching Aboriginal languages in partnership with their local Aboriginal communities. This year, up to 32 early childhood services will teach ten different Aboriginal languages.



It is very important that you consult with you doctors and provided the school with a current plan asap. It is also important that your doctor fills when the next plan up-date is due. We will also have an option to sign a form to say your child's reaction is very mild/minor and a plan is not required. Student Absence

The <u>School Attendance Guidelines</u> specify that from the end of Term 2 2018, government schools must contact parents/carers as soon as practicable on the day of an unexplained student absence.

Protecting the safety and well -being of children through the reporting and monitoring of absenteeism is the responsibility of both parents/carers and schools. Parents/carers have obligation to notify the school of their child's absence and schools are required to notify parents/carers on the day of unexplained student absence.

CONVEYANCE ALLOWANCE

Who can apply

The conveyance allowance is available to families who meet the certain criteria.

Students attending a specialist school or special setting must:

- attend their nearest government or non-government specialist school or Department-recognised special setting
- reside 4.8km or more by the shortest practicable route from school or nearest bus stop

be of school age (5 to 18 years old at time of application) and reside in Victoria.

Apply for the allowance

Families can complete an application form and submit it to their school, or the school can complete the form on their behalf.

Schools then lodge the application via the Student Conveyance Allowance System.

If you have not received a form please contact the office.

Applications close: 8th March 2018
