Safety of your children is paramount

The safety of students and our entire school community is paramount. To support this the school will adopt a number of measures to minimise the chances of students, staff and families becoming unwell.

- Parents are to drop their children off at the gate and not enter the school grounds (if possible)
- Parents are to wait beside their cars at the end of the day and their children will be brought to them by a staff member
- Any student (or staff) that show signs of illness will be sent home
- Buses will have the right to refuse access to students that show signs of illness
- Staff have been tested to ensure they are not carrying the virus
- Personal Protective Equipment is available for staff when required


- Hand hygiene and how to cough/sneeze will be taught in class

YEAR 10 IMMUNISATION


Year 10 Immunisation will now take place at school on Thursday 18th June from 9:00.
