Covid 19

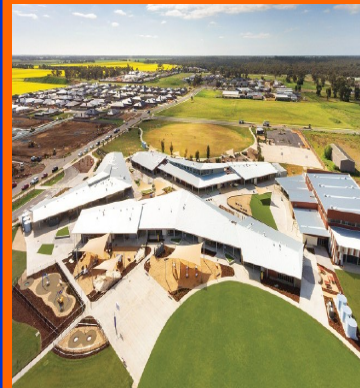
At Echuca Twin Rivers Specialist School, we continue to be guided by the latest health advice and are promoting social distancing, mask wearing and hand hygiene.

All staff are reviewing the PBSP's for the students. Some of the changes include adding the accessible spaces at school including the bike track, trampoline and the swing.



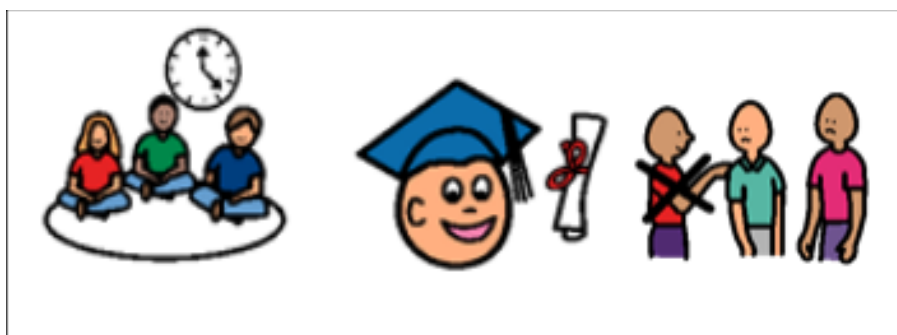
School Bus
