#### WHAT IS PBS

The Positive Behaviour Support (PBS) program helps schools to create positive learning environments by developing proactive whole school systems to define, teach and support appropriate student behaviours.

PBS applies evidence based approaches, practices and strategies for all students to increase academic performance, improve safety, decrease problem behaviour and establish a positive school culture.

PBS places a major focus on teaching and modelling appropriate behaviours to create a safe, positive and productive learning environment.





#### POSITIVE BEHAVIOUR STRATEGY

This year the school continues to use Positive Behaviour Strategies to teach students positive ways to behave. Students might be coming home with stars or smiley faces stamped on their hands. They might also be coming home with certificates showing when they have displayed positive behaviours ten times.

A smiley face means they have shown general great behaviour. A star means that the student has displayed the targeted behaviour for the week.

#### FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

#### CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS

outdoors, excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works and ports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are part of a healthy curriculum.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refuge families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

- \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school students

If you applied for the CSEF at your child's school in 2018, you do not need to complete an application form in 2019 unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

#### CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCUSION FUND (CSEF)

If you are a new family and hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent you may be eligible for CSEF. An application form was sent home with your child on Tuesday. If you haven't received this please contact the office.

Current families who already receive this funding do not need to reapply.

#### SCHOOL FEES

Statements will be sent home within the next week. Families/Carers can pay fees in full or on a term by term basis. Fees can be paid in cash, Eftpos or via internet banking. Details will be on the statement.

Primary fees are \$220

Secondary fees are \$260



#### **CENTREPAY**

Centrepay is a service available to families that receive welfare payments. This service allows families to instruct Centrelink to take a nominated amount from their Centrelink payment to go toward school fees.
